

switch roles and play again. Show arrangements of 5-10 objects, use objects with a simple shape and not too many colors.

***Teddy Bear Picnic:** The goal is to get the bear (or other object) from home to the picnic. The cards tell you how far to move your game piece. Play until the first bear reaches the picnic or all bears get there.

***How Many to 10?** Students use the recording sheet and Ten-Frame Cards. They turn over a card and color in that many dots on the first 10-Frame. Then they write the number for those dots on the first line of the addition sentence. Then they choose another color to color in the remaining extra spaces and write the number for that group on the next part of the equation so the two numbers added together equal 10.

***Build It. Teen Numbers:** Use a deck of Teen Number Cards and a game board. Turn over the first card and identify the number. Color in the dots on the game board, then record the answer on the Recording Sheet.

***Roll and Record Teen Numbers:** Use the Teen Number Cards, the Recording Sheet, and objects to count for each number card (20 pennies or buttons or beads). Turn over the first card. Make that amount with the objects. Then record the number on the recording sheet.
